

Mrs. Halvey Dies; Author, Editor 92

Mrs. Margaret M. Halvey, author and editor, died Tuesday night at her home, 5116 Regent st., after a long illness. She was 92.

Born in Kilabban, Leix, Ireland, Mrs. Halvey was the widow of Timothy F. Halvey, founder of the first Gaelic schools in New York and Philadelphia.

Secretary of the American Anti-Vivisection Society and managing editor of its publication, *The A-V* for 47 years, she was active in Catholic charitable organizations and was the author of a number of poems and short stories which appeared in various magazines throughout the United States.

The first woman secretary of the American Catholic Historical Society, Mrs. Halvey also was recording secretary of the Sursum Corda Society. At one time she was acting manager for the Society for Prevention of Cruelty to Animals.

In her early days in America, Mrs. Halvey served on the Parnell Committee and later represented Pennsylvania on the Ladies' Auxiliary Board of the World's Columbian Exposition in Chicago.

She is survived by a son, Brendan H., a daughter, Miss Nina Halvey, and two grandchildren, Robert S. Halvey and Miss Patricia M. Halvey.

Solemn requiem mass will be sung at 10 A. M. Monday at St. Francis de Sales Church, 47th st. and Springfield ave. Burial will be in Holy Cross Cemetery.
